The final conference was successful and with high level of contributions and discussion, and at the conference attended 61 persons.

The three testing sessions in Switzerland, Italy and Poland were highly appreciated and had, also considering only this result, a considerable impact, in fact the overall effect can be envisaged in about 150 caregivers for the three testing sessions; 15 trainers involved in testing sessions; about 20 other care professionals (nurses, care coordinators services, social workers, etc.); about 200 trainees, students and trainers in the four Info-days; other 30 caregivers that are attending the training "Diploma cantonale per collaboratrici famigliare" that will be replicated and lasts for all 2016.

The final publication is on the right way and is really qualitative. The prestigious publisher "Scholars' press" confirmed definitely the intention to issue the book.

In Ticino a training process based on the ICT Training model is already working, therefore it's a first important success on sustainability and exploitation sides of the project.
